


## A short report on 2018 and an outlook on 2019


God and so many good friends like you filled 2018 with more blessings than we can count!

## Looking ahead to 2019

That leads us to VEJ's new focus starting in 2019: Food.

- Did you know that <u>83 percent</u> of humanity's total carbon footprint comes from <u>what we eat</u>?
- Did you know that 1.3 billion tons of food waste goes into landfills every year?
- Did you know that that food waste costs \$940 billion a year? Imagine what that money could do!

If the point of VEJ is to help more people of faith learn how to care for Earth and each other, the facts show that food is the way to do it!




There's more: <u>Eating brings people together</u>. We are a faith-based organization that seeks to work with people of all faiths. It is often hard for people of different faiths to know where to begin when trying to understand each other. Since food is at the center of almost all faiths, we think that sharing food with each other is the heart of VEJ's interfaith work.

VEJ's new focus on food is really not *that* new. While Naim Edwards and Patty Gillis were with the organization, they made the neighborhood garden and neighborhood potlucks the biggest part of their work. We're simply building on what Naim and Patty did so well.

## In 2019, we want to reach and teach 1,200 people how to "eat for Earth justice."

Those people will come from many communities, faiths, and walks of life. Many of them will be children and young people. We want to give them simple lessons and practices they can take back to their families, houses of worship, neighborhoods, and schools. This is how VEJ will make an impact.









To reach and serve more people in 2019, VEJ will take some of its programs to houses of worship and schools in the southeast Michigan region. We are also hosting almost 20 tours that introduce people to Earth-friendly food organizations and southeast Michigan's natural wonders.

We believe these are the things we need to do for VEJ

to be true to its mission and to make the best use of energy, money, and time.
